### LIBRARY COLLECTIONS AND SERVICES

Despite the ongoing COVID – 19 Pandemic through 2021, the Wollaston Public Library continued to adapt its services to align with the Provincial and Local Public Health requirements.

As a result, the library was closed to the public for 36 weeks, and instead provided curbside pick up, along with online services through Overdrive and Inter Library Loans during these temporary restrictions. The following outlines the data on the core services we have been able to provide.

Average 134 in-person patron visits per month Overdrive usage increased from 145 to 183 per month

Inter Library Loans increased from 13 to 18 per month

#### PROGRAMMING:

The Library extends its appreciation and thanks to the Friends of Wollaston Public Library (FOWL) who provided \$1250.00 to support children's books and programming. Unfortunately, due to COVID 19 restrictions, FOWL members were not meeting. We were pleased to provide the following programming activities: Spring coloring books, flower and butterfly mosaic kits, valentine's day craft bag, Good in every grain seed kit, St. Patrick's day crafts, Christmas take and make painting ornament kits, Halloween candy guessing contest and blind date with a book. We also ran the TD summer reading program. (sponsored by TD Canada)

#### OPERATIONAL IMPROVEMENTS

Thank you to the Township of Wollaston for including IT supports in our 2021 Service Agreement. This allowed the library, to implement much needed safety and security protections on the CEO's Computer and 2 patron computers and the Wi-Fi system.

The CEO's system is now backed up and, in the future, we anticipate being able to report on usage of the Wi-Fi system.

In addition, the Township Staff has supported the library by sharing cleaning supplies and by dropping off bank deposits for the library.



#### GOVERNANCE ACHIEVEMENTS:

The Board was able to finalize and update the outstanding policies and procedures that needed review. It created a Volunteer Program & Policy. It has finalized and implemented all its Pay Equity obligations to ensure compliance with legislative requirements.

#### 2022 ACTIVITIES

For 2022 the Library Board is working on updating its Strategic Plan and will be considering how it might support the Township in its endeavors to obtain a new Community Hub and Library.
